Nanos poll finds mass exodus of doctors likely

There are more warnings of a mass exodus of Ontario doctors if the McGuinty government goes ahead with its planned \$1.1 B in cuts to medical fees and programs.

A Nanos Research poll of 5,596 MD's suggest 41 per cent would consider moving to another jurisdiction.

Ontario would also see early retirement and staff layoffs in practices from about a third of doctors.

More than 8 in 10 doctors say the Province isn't being responsible and they think the plans by the government will turn young people away from practising medicine in Ontario.

The poll was commissioned by the Ontario Medical Association and found 82 percent of doctors support the OMA's plans to freeze fees instead of cutting them and to look for \$250 M in additional savings.

Nine in ten doctors want a conciliator brought in to settle this dispute.
